The Spirit Living In You Romans 8:1-4

Introduction: New Life with Spirit – Fruit of the spirit

Old Life without Spirit – the desires of the Flesh

Therefore.... No Condemnation – Romans 8:1

"Therefore" means that based on everything we learned in the previous chapter(s)...

You are not condemned.... Even though you deserve to be condemned...

- 1. Being unwilling to forgive yourself, leads to work-based salvation. "I should have known better...."
- 2. Guilt that leads to shame can lead to addiction. Breaking the cycle of addiction involves breaking the feelings of shame.

For Those Who Believe in Christ – Romans 8:2

Law of the Spirit is the Subject.

Freedom from the Law of Sin and Death is the action.

Chapter 7 describes what it is like when we try to live on our own abilities. (will power)

Chapter 8 describes what it is like when we live by faith.

The Failure of the Law and Divine Action - Romans 8:3-4

- 1. The Law was good, but the flesh was weak.
- 2. The Law was doomed to fail, because it could not change the human condition.
- 3. Foundational theology included in these verses
 - Jesus, the son of God, became Human. Because fully human he understood what it felt like to be tested. Because he was fully God, he did not sin.
 - Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice. (One time) Being in the flesh, allowed God to condemn sin with the sacrifice of his Son.
 - Those who believe in Christ are righteous. (Made right with God)
 - Our Faith allows God's spirit to live in us.

Jesus mission was to deal with the sin problem so you could relate with his Father!!!
