

WEEKLY VERSE: Help one another in love. *Galatians 5:13*

LIFE POINT: People at church give and help others.



The people in the Jerusalem church heard about a new church in Antioch. They sent Barnabas to visit the Antioch church. Barnabas encouraged the people in the new church to serve God, teach about Jesus, and learn about Him. Many people in Antioch began to believe that Jesus was God's Son.

Barnabas brought Saul to Antioch to help teach the people. They stayed in Antioch for a year. More people in Antioch began to believe in Jesus. The people who believed in Jesus were called Christians.

One day some men from Jerusalem came to the Antioch church. One of the men, a prophet named Agabus, told the church that soon the people in Judea would not have enough food to eat. Many people would be hungry.

The people in the Antioch church decided to help. Everyone in the Antioch church gave as much food and money as they could. They were happy to give. Barnabas and Saul took their gifts to the people in the church in Judea. Now the people would have food. The people were thankful that the church in Antioch had helped them.
